Once a year on 30 August the Turkish Government closes the Dardanelles for an open water swim. 30 August is Turkish Victory day, commemorating the battle in 1922 when Turkey was again able to establish itself as a nation after World War 1. The swim follows in the footsteps of Leander in ancient times, Lord Byron in 1810 and Commander (later Major General and GOC 1 NZ Div in WW2) Freyberg in 1915. The distance is 4.5 kilometres, and the swim is very well administered by the Turkish authorities. The distance is not straight across the Dardanelles but at an angle due to the current, in the swimmers' favour.

In 2010, we at Military History Tours conducted a tour where participants were able to experience Turkish culture, visit the Battlefields of Gallipoli and take part in the Dardanelles Open Water Swim. Members of our tour group came second and third overall in the swim, Murray Rose who hosted the tour, and should again in 2011 won for his age bracket

The tour provides time and facilities for swimmers to acclimatise and prepare for the swim. Our accommodation is on the Adriatic coast not far south of ANZAC Cove, there are no currents in the sea, and a 25 metre pool at the hotel.

The weather in Turkey at that time of the year is great, air temperature is around 30 degrees and the sea very comfortable to swim in. You will not be in Turkey for ANZAC Day, but will be there on a date that is very close to the 96th anniversary of the victory at Lone Pine and the action at the Nek that was immortalised in the film Gallipoli.

Military History Tours has taken Australians to the places where their ancestors fought in Europe Africa and Asia for over 23 Years. Your guides on this tour will be a local Turkish guide steeped in the history of Turkey and also a member of Colonel Graham Fleeton's corps of experienced battlefield guides. Colonel Graham Fleeton of Military History Tours has established a corps of guides who are all former soldiers; trained in battle techniques, and steeped in the history; due to their military training they are able to give an uncommon level of insight.

If you had an ancestor who served on Gallipoli and are able to provide details of your ancestor prior to the commencement of the tour, Military History Tours will take every effort to ensure you see exactly where that ancestor fought and if they had paid the supreme sacrifice, give you the opportunity to visit their grave and hold a short service of remembrance. Military History Tours also provides a unique service that allows family and friends to follow tour progress online with daily reports that include photos and video. COMMUNITY NEWS

Energy prices are set to skyrocket over the coming years with a 19% increase in about six week's time. Forecasts predict an increase of approximately 20% each financial year over the next few years. The reason for the increase is because we Australian's are using more and more energy. More energy means that more network infrastructure (poles and wires) is required to transport the energy from the generators (90% of which are coal fired power stations) to homes and businesses across the community. Installing a solar power system is arguably the best way to reduce your exposure to rising electricity prices at the same time when you install a solar power system you are taking pressure off the grid by generating power on-site. This is called distributed generation.

Currently there is a Federal Government subsidy for home owners to install solar PV called 'Solar Credits'. Solar Credits reduce the cost of installing solar PV by thousands of dollars. Solar Credits multiply the number of renewable energy certificated a solar PV system can generate by a factor of five for the first 1.5kW's of solar installed. The Government was going to gradually phase this out by dropping the multiplier from 5 to 4 to 3 etc each financial year, though they have just announced that instead of dropping to a factor of 4 after 30 June 2011, they are dropping to a factor of 3. What does this mean for a household that wants to install solar? Depending on system size it could mean the difference of about 2-3 thousand dollars.

The most intelligent way to beat the increase in energy prices is simple: create your own energy.

SOLAR AT SOUTH CURLY



Autonomous Energy donated a 1.5kW solar photovoltaic (PV) system to South Curl Curl Surf Life Saving Club. The solar PV system is connected to the electricity grid and the Surf Club will be paid 66 cents per kWh for every unit of electricity produced by the solar PV system, thanks to the NSW Solar Bonus Scheme. This means the Surf Club will receive approximately \$1,700 per year for the energy it produces until 2017. Autonomous Energy donated all the equipment, provided labour from their experience in-house installation team, and arranged the gross feed-in tariff metering and connection at no cost to the Surf Club.

The solar PV system output will be one of the best performing systems in Sydney. This is due to a number of important factors: Kyocera solar modules were installed, which have been independently tested and shown to perform better than any other solar PV module available (see www.dkasolarcentre.com.au); the installation was installed by Autonomous Energy's experienced in-house installation team comprising internationally experienced Solar PV Engineers, Licensed Electricians and Clean Energy Council Accredited Installers and the system features the most efficient inverter available in Australia as well as other premium quality system components. In addition the Surf Club has a perfect north facing roof with no shading, so the system will be producing clean, green energy all day every day. Autonomous Energy anticipates the system will generate 2,571kWh per year, saving 2,751 kg CO₂-e per year.

The system was officially opened by the Mayor of Warringah Council: Cr. Michael Regan on Friday 11th March 2011. The NSW Treasurer Mike Baird was also in attendance at the exclusive launch event hosted by Autonomous Energy at the Club.
