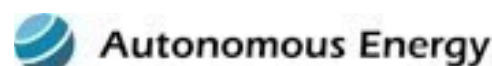
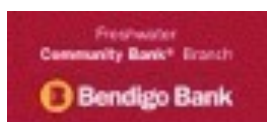

Training Update

The next Bronze squad will probably kick off in early February (start date TBC, most likely Thursday 4th February), with training on Thursday afternoons and Saturday mornings. We will also be organising some ARTC, Spinal Management and Provide First Aid courses in early 2016 to strengthen our patrols. Please look out for course details which will be promoted via SurfGuard messages, in the Patrol Room, and on TeamApp.

Proficiencies for this season have to be completed by 31 December, which involves quite a lot of effort as we have around 250 patrolling members with multiple awards (a testament to the strength of the Club, and to Spook and others' persistent effort over many years).

Building on last year a number of proficiencies have been completed during patrol hours. This is a great way for individual patrolling members to maintain their skills whilst they are on patrol, and for patrol teams to work on their ability to manage incidents and scenarios.

One area of special focus for this this season is Spinal Management proficiencies and refresher training. Due to the high number of spinal incidents across the northern beaches and New South Wales (multiple incidents on some weekends), we are now required to have a proficient Spinal Management Award holder on each Patrol. There are a couple of sessions left, so please book in to one of the sessions if you need to complete this proficiency.

Thank you to everyone that has helped run the proficiency sessions, and to all the patrolling members that have taken the opportunity to keep their skills up to date.
